## From The Kitchen

### **Iced Pumpkin Cookies**

2 ½ c. flour

1 teaspoon baking soda

½ teaspoon salt

1 ½ c. sugar

1 egg

1 teaspoon baking powder

1 Tablespoon cinnamon

½ c. butter, softened

1 c. pumpkin

1 tsp. Vanilla extract

### **Glaze**

2. Powdered sugar

1 Tablespoon, butter, melted

3 Tablespoons milk

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

- Cream together butter, sugar, pumpkin, egg, and vanilla until light and fluffy
- Sift together flour, baking powder, baking soda, cinnamon, and salt
- Add creamed mixture to the dry, and mix together
- Scoop onto lined cookie sheet
- Bake at 350° for 15 - 20 minutes, until lightly browned on the bottoms. Remove from oven, and allow to cool.
- Prepare glaze by combining powdered sugar, milk, melted butter, and vanilla, and mixing until smooth.
- Spoon glaze over cooled cookies, and allow glaze to set up firm.
